## CONCLUSIONS

In Sonning Common of family households 61% no longer had dependent children - very slightly higher than elsewhere.

In Sonning Common of family households only 4% had a single dependent child aged 0-4% - less than elsewhere.

In Sonning Common of family households only 5% had three or more children with the youngest aged 0-18% - rather less than elsewhere.

Within family households, generally patterns seem to broadly mirror those elsewhere.
